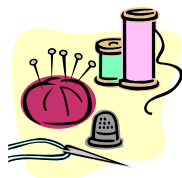

Coppermoose Farm is a privately owned CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) Farm in the Synderville Basin. Their three acre farm, supported by a 2400 square foot passive solar greenhouse and one hoophouse, produces certified organic vegetables and cut flowers for the Park City Community. With veggies and posies come the birds and the bees - and quite a healthy population of them! We might even discover what secret things the birds and bees do in a hoophouse, provided it is appropriate for family audiences. You're likely to meet some very eco-friendly insects (leave the fly swatter at home), birds, and animals whose sole job is to maintain a balanced ecosystem. Coppermoose Farms offers a variety of vegetable and flower packages for sale, so bring extra money besides your \$10 tour fee. Since the Farm is centrally located, no need to carpool. The Farm is on Old Ranch Road just off of the 224. Meet there in time for our 10:30 tour by the Farm Manager, and we will conduct a shoe-check to ensure that you are wearing sensible, practical, comfortable farm touring shoes. We cannot wander around because the hoophouse houses secret military secrets and the aforementioned eco-friendly animals might be carnivores who will look at you as a "balanced" meal. Seeing all these scrumptious veggies will probably make you hungry, so we'll lunch at Ruby Tuesday where you can order from a special \$9 menu, including a beverage of the non-spirited version.
